






Home Learning Choice Board 13 - 17 April 2020 Senior School Students

<p>Te Reo Māori Find out who the kaitiaki are for the elements. Draw/sketch your version of them, write 4 facts about each. E.g. Tangaroa is the kaitiaki of the Moana.</p> 	<p>Tuhituhi - Writing Your topic is whānau. Write a story describing what each member of your whānau looks like, and one or two things that are special about them. Sketch your whānau portrait, or draw koru patterns to represent each person.</p>	<p>Pangarau - Math <u>Number of the day</u> Complete the activities for the number of the day.</p> 
<p>Korikori Tinana - Fitness Go Noodle Pirate Ship Go Noodle Red Carpet See if you can get your whānau up with you.</p> 	<p>Manaakitanga Service to others Help out with the chores and write a diary entry explaining what chores you did for the day. Folding the washing Sweeping the floor etc</p>	<p>Kupu - Vocabulary See how many other words you can make from the word 'hospitality'. You are only allowed to use the letters as many times as they appear in the word. You could make this a competition with your whānau.</p>
<p>Pānui - Reading Watch a movie with the subtitles going.</p>	<p>Wā Whānau - Family time Play cards, a board game, cook dinner or bake some goodies. Tell each person what you appreciate about them.</p>	<p>READ! READ! READ! It does not matter what you read, just read everyday. Keep a reading log to show all the books you have read (or movie captions).</p>
<p>Kaupapa - Topic studies Read about and research an event in history. E.g. Tangiwai Disaster, Waitangi, Maori land wars etc. Create a timeline, write 5 questions including who, what, why, when and where.</p>	<p>Behaviour learning Gratitude diary One positive aspect coming out of having to isolate is having time to appreciate those around us, and everything we have. Write a list of all the things you are thankful for.</p>	<p>Be creative!! Build it! Sketch it! Write about it! Use resources from home to build a masterpiece, then sketch it and write about it.
