




## Junior School Students

 <p><b><u>Sally the Snake</u></b> Can you think of words that have the s sound in them like Sally the snake? Write them down or say them to someone in your family.</p>	<p><b><u>Letter box numbers</u></b></p> <p>How many different numbers can you find on letterboxes when you go on a walk with your whānau? Say the name of the numbers. Try and add some of the numbers together if you can!</p>	<p><b>Shape Match</b></p> <p>Sort objects you can find in your house into different shapes How many circles can you find? How many squares? How many rectangles? How many triangles? How many hexagons? How many ovals?</p> 
<p><b><u>Colour Scavenger Hunt</u></b> Inside your house find things with these colours. Black, white, purple, brown, light green, dark green, blue, red, orange. Now go outside and see how many things you can find in the garden with those colours.</p>	<p><b><u>Playdough</u></b> Make some playdough together and have fun playing and learning at the same time.</p> <p><b><u>Playdough</u></b></p> <p>Mix together 1 cup salt 2 tablespoons oil 1 tablespoon cream of tartar 2 cups boiling water Add a little food colouring and mix together Add 2 rounded cups of flour and mix together Knead until mixture is smooth</p>	<p>Keep the rhymes going.... Write the names of all the people in your bubble.</p>	<p>Practice making words with these first 8 sounds from Milo Monkey's Birthday Surprise book:  m s f a p t c i  Here is one to start: c a t cat</p>	<p>Imagine that there are no more restrictions on where we can go.
