




## Home Learning Choice Board

### Sustainability - The Big Picture: The Earth as an Apple Activity


You will need:

- An apple
- a knife

1. Take the apple. The whole apple represents planet Earth. Breathe on it - this is the atmosphere around the earth.
2. About 3/4 of the Earth is covered by oceans. Cut apple into quarters and remove three of the pieces, leaving only one-quarter of the apple in your hand. This 1/4 represents land.
3. 1/3 of the remaining quarter is desert, too dry to live on. Cut off about a third,



leaving a little more than two-thirds of the quarter, or about  $\frac{1}{6}$  of the apple.  
 4. Another  $\frac{1}{3}$  is mountains, too high to live on. Cut the remaining piece in half, leaving a little more than one twelfth of the apple.  
 5. Of this remaining piece, only the crust (skin) is used as living space for humans and other land animals - trim the skin from the small piece of apple.  
 6. How long it will be before our lifestyles and growing populations take up all the available living space? Eat the remaining skin to symbolise consuming the living space.
