Deanwell School's Procedure Plan for Alert Level 2

School is OPEN. School is safe and we are all ready for learning.

The following procedures have been developed with the safety of employees and students in mind, and have been aligned to the Ministry of Education guidelines.



- **Deanwell School opening hours are 8.30am - 3.00pm**

**NO STUDENTS ARE TO ARRIVE EARLIER THAN
8.30am**

- In the morning, only the staff car park gate will be open from 8.30 - 9.00am
- In the afternoon, students will be released for pick up from the front of the school
- If you require entry into school outside the gate opening hours you will need to practice safe distancing and line up outside the front office

- **During Alert Level 2 we ask whānau, parents and caregivers to only come onto school grounds if it is necessary.**

- We will keep a contact tracing register of all adults who come onto school grounds.

- We will have staff at the gate where they will support our whānau, parents and caregivers to complete the contact tracing register

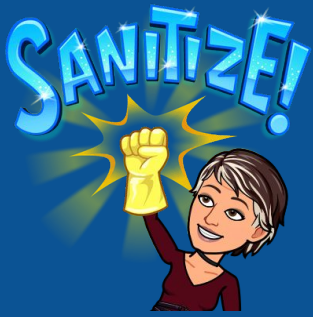
- We ask that you abide by the physical distancing rules

- That you record your
 - name
 - address
 - phone number
 - purpose of visit
 - movement and location in school
 - time of entry and exit

- **PICK UP AFTER SCHOOL**

- Pīpī Manu, Kārearea and Kererū will be out the front of the school by 3.00pm ready for pick up

Students need to bring to school...

- A named water bottle.
- Their own food for playtime ONLY. School lunches will still be provided. We are not allowed to share kai.

- Each OHU has disinfectant wipes that teachers can use to wipe any hard surfaces where and when necessary
- We will continue to model and teach good hygiene practices (coughing into one's elbow, handwashing and drying, applying hand sanitizer)
- Hand sanitiser will be provided in every classroom. Students and staff will use this hand sanitiser. Regular hand washing will also be taught with regular reminders.

Cleaning and Hygiene



- Physical distancing is a good precaution to prevent the spread of disease. There does not need to be a specific measurement but where practicable 1 metre should be used as a guide.
- Students and employees should be far enough away from each other so that they are not breathing on, or touching each other.
 - We should all maintain a free 'Moist Breath Zone'.
- Students who continually choose not to follow appropriate physical distancing will have their whānau contacted and may be asked to go home. We are not willing to risk the safety of students or employees.

- **We love all of our tamariki dearly. Air hugs and elbow shakes return.**
- Can you please speak with your child/children to emphasize the importance of physical distancing and that their teachers still love them even though we can't hug them?
- Communicating with our whānau is so important to us. Instead of you coming onto school grounds please feel free to email your child/children's teacher with any concerns or questions. Teachers will be checking their emails regularly.
- Teacher emails are listed on our Deanwell School website.



- Students and staff need to stay home if they are unwell. Anyone who becomes unwell with symptoms of Covid 19 during the school day will be sent home.
- Our contact tracing is a combination of attendance, timetable, and visitor registers. These provide good information to health authorities if they need to contact people that might be considered a close contact of a confirmed case, and determine whether they will need to self-isolate.
