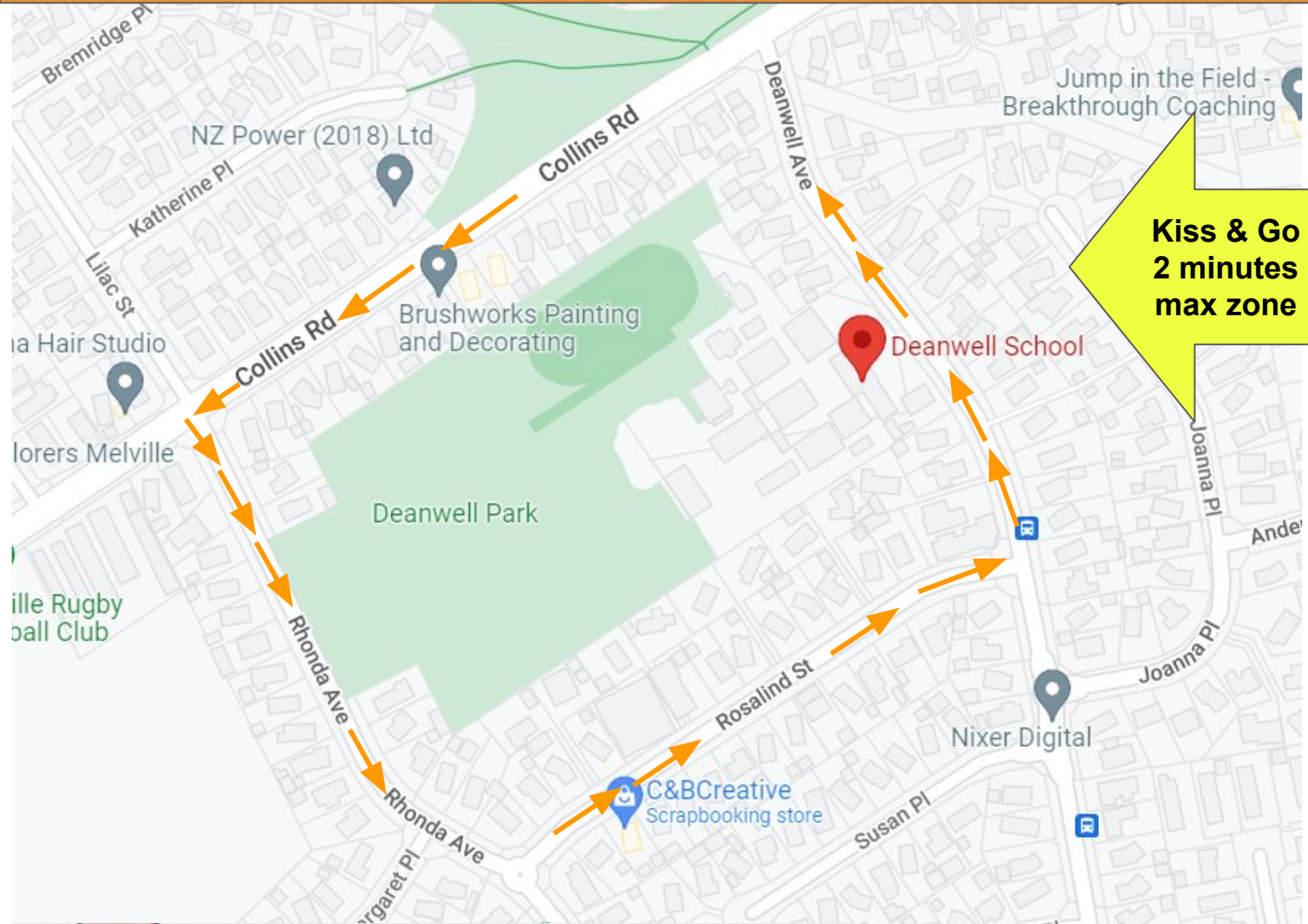
Pōwhiri will be Tuesday 31st January, 2023 at 9.00am

Due to the closure we need to create a safer drop off and pick up procedure before and after school.

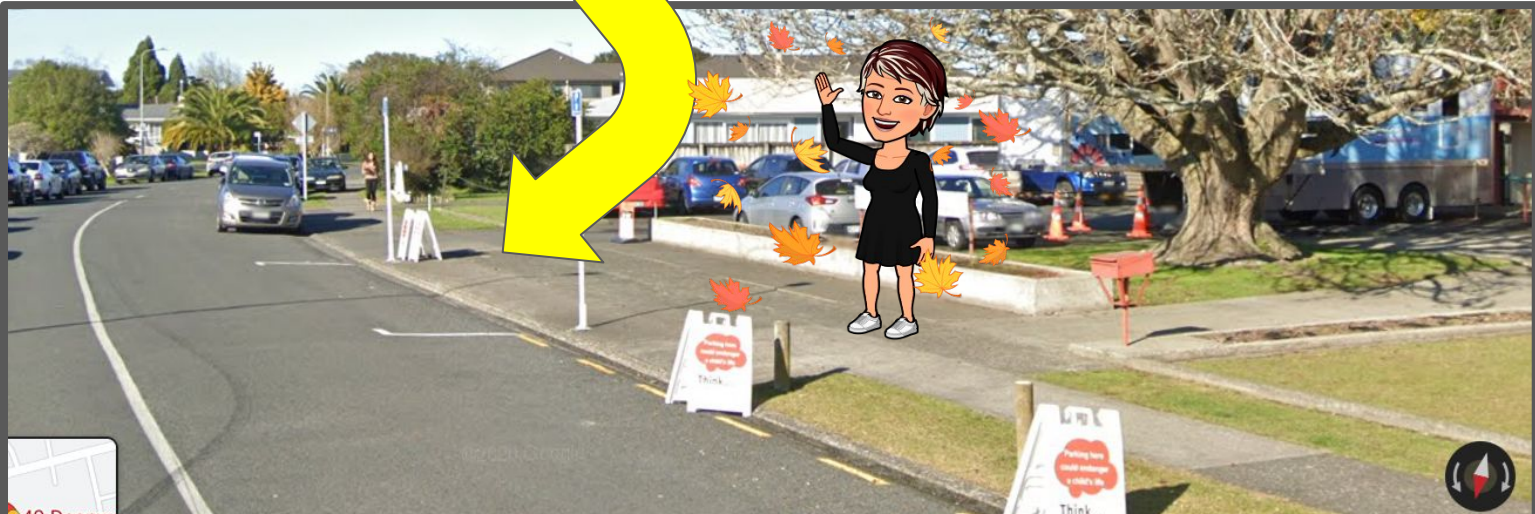


For whānau 'kissing and going' let's trial driving in the same direction along Deanwell Avenue.



For the safety of our tamariki we cannot have vehicles pulling into driveways and backing out to turn around. It is just TOO DANGEROUS!

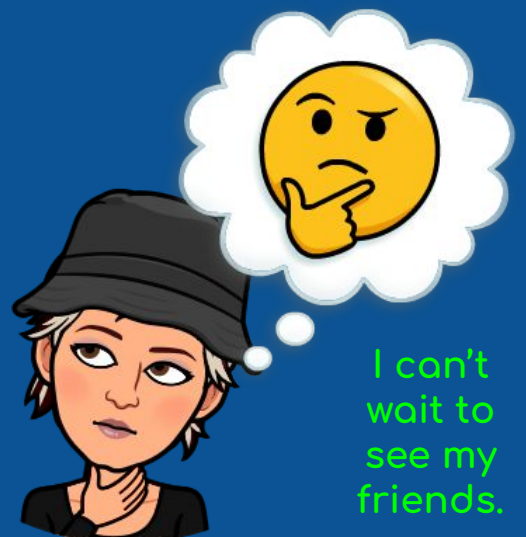

Rationale/Pūtake

Te Tiriti o Waitangi/the Treaty of Waitangi establishes a committed working partnership between Māori and the New Zealand Government. This policy is to provide the foundation on which both the 'Partners' as represented by the NZ Government through Deanwell School, and Māori whānau and their students attending will enact their responsibilities as one of the Te Tiriti o Waitangi/the Treaty of Waitangi partners.

This unique partnership, shall be reflected in the operational and governing protocols of Deanwell School, with its foundation based on the principles of partnership, participation and protection for Māori as expressed through the Waitangi Tribunal.

This is one of the minimum standards and expectation of every registered teacher in Aotearoa. Each year each registered teacher must be able to provide evidence that they are meeting this standard.
