- . Does not give out personal information online.
- · Will help others to become a better digital citizen.

Because we know this is important for us all, we ask everyone - the staff, school who are accessing the network, to agree to use the internet and o way. This means they will follow the rules laid out in the Responsible Use

If someone does not act responsibly, or the things that they do mean that may stop them from using the internet or other technologies at school.

Annual Timeline

All new enrolments to Dearwell School will be required to read and sign t read the agreement the caregiver is required to help the student underst-

Digital Citizenship Responsible Use Agreement

When using information, communication, and technology (ICT) at Deanwell School I will always be a good digital citizen. This means that I will:

Use ICT to communicate to others in a respectful and positive way.

- 1. I understand that in most cases my school owns the devices I will be using
- 2. I will be given a school email address.
- 3. I will only use my own Deanwell address with my own password.
- 4. Teachers can look at my device and history at any time (students will not clear their history).
- 5. I will not use devices for inappropriate messages or comments.

Take precautions to prevent viruses.

I will not open an attachment to an email if I do not know the person who sent the email. Just because an email comes from a friend does not mean it's virus free. I should be using current anti-virus software on my computer at home to help avoid viruses.

Recognise what material is appropriate for Deanwell School.

When accessing and using online materials I will keep in mind the Deanwell School values and the various regulations, such as copyright, that apply to digital material. I will not access or use digital material that is not appropriate at Deanwell School. If something inappropriate comes up I know to turn off the screen or close the device and tell my teacher right away.

Not give out personal information online

While online, I will not give out personal information about myself like where I live, my phone number, age, last name or where I am going. Meeting someone online does not make them our friend. Unless I am introduced by a teacher or parent, anyone I meet online is a stranger.

Help others to become better digital citizens.

I will model being a good digital citizen by helping others to understand the points mentioned above and I will always think carefully about my responsibilities when using technology.

I know to only use digital technology and the school email for school use. Having a school email address is a privilege and it will be removed if I use it inappropriately.
