On Wednesday 22nd March between 9.00am and 12.00pm, the school will have no power.

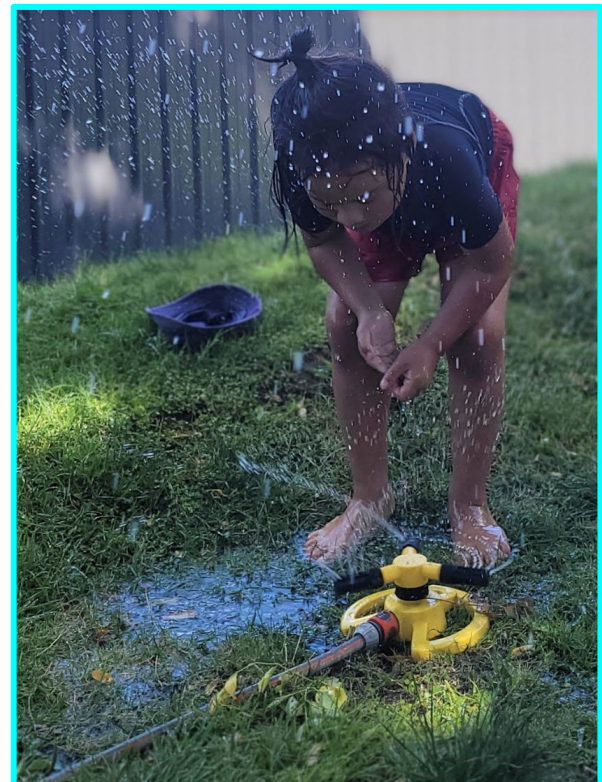
We will still be open, but will be working in the dark!

# NOTICE FROM HAMILTON CITY COUNCIL

Hamilton City Council will be working with Waipa Civil to upgrade the wastewater pipes along Collins Road and Prisk Street over the next three months, which will help to reduce the number of overflows happening in the area and protect the well-being of the community and the environment.



Contractors Waipa Civil will be on site next Monday, 20 March, with works along Collins Road, expected to take about four weeks into mid-late April. Two-way traffic flow will be maintained along Collins Road, so students, parents/caregivers, teachers, and staff can access the school without problems. The footpath and cycle lane on the opposite side of the road to Melville High School will be closed, but there will be signage around this.

There are likely to be some delays around the area, as there usually are with construction happening, so if you can pass on the message to add some travel time, that would be appreciated.

The council is conscious that between Melville High School and Deanwell Primary School, there will be an increased vehicle and pedestrian traffic around peak times - 8.30 am - 9 am and 2.30 pm - 3.30 pm. Contractors know this and will work to ensure that traffic flow is maintained and pedestrians are helped out as needed.
