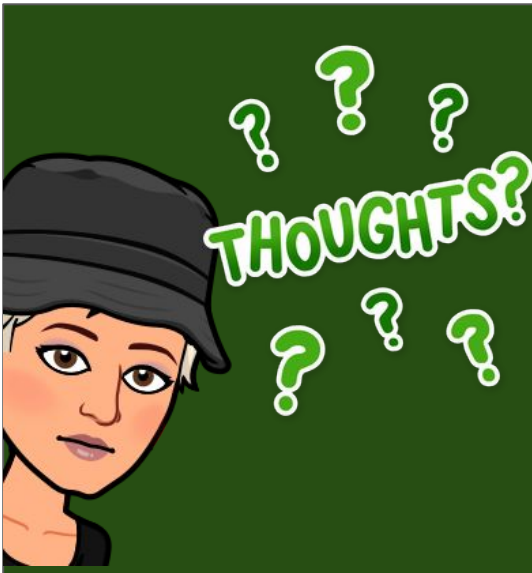
The Board are critical leaders in our school. They are collectively responsible for:
