

Our Board is committed to having all employees first aid trained. This is not common practice in NZ schools. Most schools have a small number of trained employees, often the office staff and some leaders. However, our Board deems this is be extremely important.

If a student at Deanwell School requires first aid on school grounds, in a classroom or on a school trip it doesn't matter which employee gets to the student first they will know what to do and begin working through the DRSABCD, Emergency Response Plan. This consistent approach known by all employees ensures the safety of all our people.

### Every two years employees complete either a:

- First Aid Revalidation (refresher) course OR
- Essential First Aid course

### Both courses entail

- Primary assessment.
- Stable side positioning.
- Scene management of emergency situations.
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)
  - adult, child and infant.
- Use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED).
- Foreign body airway obstruction (choking)
   adult, child and infant.
- Control of life threatening bleeding.
- Bleeding, shock and wound care.
- Fractures, sprains, strains and dislocations.
- Medical conditions- heart attack, angina, asthma, diabetes, seizures, stroke and severe allergies.
- Poisoning.
- Burns thermal, chemical and electrical.


