# Can you help us keep our school safe?

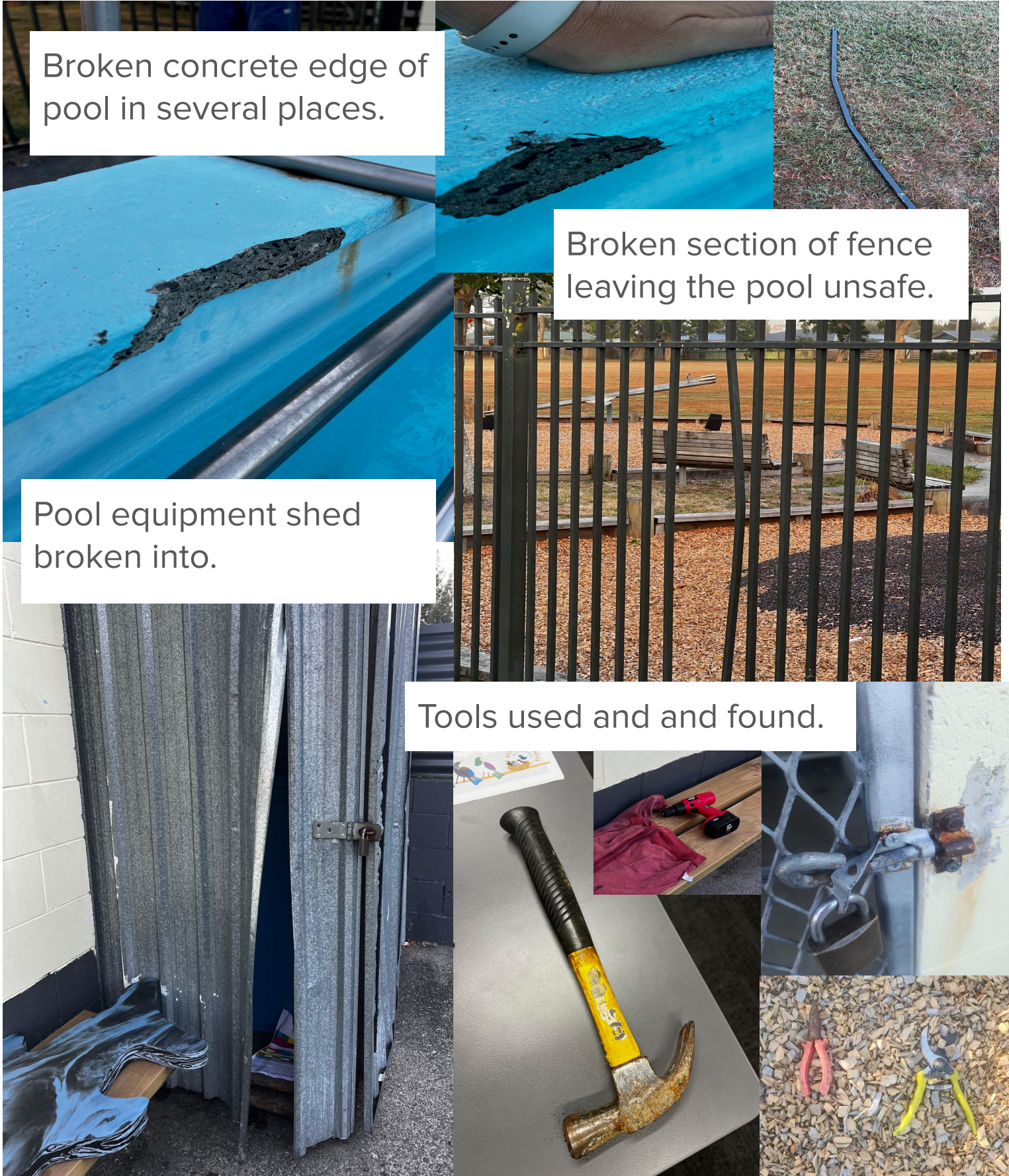
Over the weekend, our swimming pool and surrounding area were vandalised.

# Communication in the event of an emergency

The following communication methods will be utilised:

## Response

Utilising the above communication methods, we will inform parents and caregivers about:

- The situation and procedures. For instance during a lockdown, this may involve advising whānau to stay at home.
- Parents will be required to sign students out through our usual systems or directly through the classroom teacher.

Note each emergency situation is evaluated individually, and responses may vary accordingly.

Please be aware that on a termly basis, we practice our emergency procedures, including fire, lockdown, and earthquake drills. We do not inform whānau of these events and would only inform you if it was an emergency.
